

Prop Sheet Checklist

Camera

- You can use a camera or the photography app on a phone or tablet.

Characters

- Your choice of Minifigures from your collection

Props

- Think about all your LEGO Minifigure accessories and props, these could include: LEGO weapons, food pieces, LEGO vehicles and energy effects including lighting and fire pieces
- Have a look at your toy collection and see if there are other plushies or action figures that would create a fun story.
- Think about natural elements: rain, puddles, leaves, flowers, dirt.
- Can you convince your pets to get involved? A sleeping cat makes an awesome furry mountain!

Photography locations

- The best photography is Minifigure scale so your set will be small.
- Your back or front garden could become a jungle, forest, desert (if you have a sandpit). Use action and adventure movies as your inspiration!
- The exterior of your house could substitute for an alleyway, city or skyscraper.
- If shooting inside, your props become really important as this is what your Minifigures are interacting with props (see above). The best Minifigure photography involves storytelling so think about what the Minifigures will be doing. Think about spies breaking into a desk drawer. Minifigure making a mess in the kitchen, or coming alive in your bedroom like Toy Story.

Lighting

- Consider additional lighting such as lamps, or natural light. Flash photography is not recommended for Minifigures
